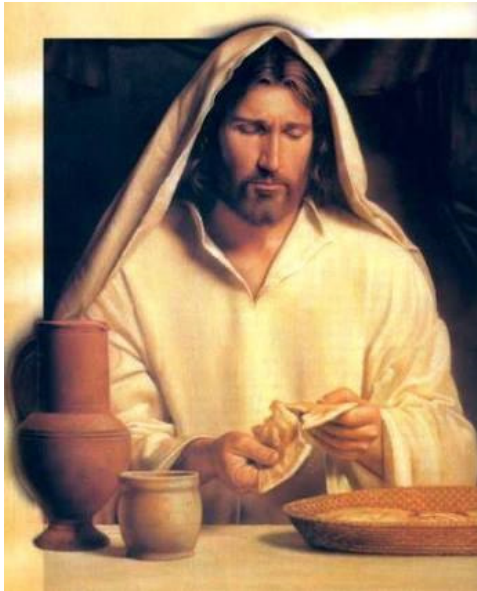

ANOTHER STEP ON OUR JOURNEY AS ODHRAN PASTORAL AREA

This weekend we begin the temporary weekend schedule for the priests of Odhran Pastoral Area. As far as possible we plan to fulfil the existing temporary weekend schedule of Masses. While the number of Masses may not present a scheduling difficulty it is the time of our Mass schedule that limits our scope. This is evident on Sunday mornings where we have a cluster of Masses between 9.30am to 12noon. If any unforeseen scenario arises (ie., illness/other commitments) we will have to adjust accordingly.

As published in Parish Newsletters a few weeks ago we are being asked as a Pastoral Area and within each of the six parishes to discern and discuss what the recent diocesan changes mean to us and how best to face the challenges ahead. The timeframe for this discussion and decision is the beginning of Advent (November 28th). This gives us time to work together as a Pastoral Area and within our parishes to discern where the Holy Spirit is guiding us in the light of the Good News. As our Reading from St. Paul to the Ephesians in this weekend's Mass assures us *'Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God who has marked you with his seal for you to be set free when the day comes'*.

Christian Churches Prepare for 'Climate Sunday'

Less than three months remain before the UN Climate Conference hosted by the Scottish city of Glasgow from 31 October to 12 November. To prepare for that event, several Christian organizations are multiplying their awareness and advocacy initiatives, and are encouraging people to take concrete actions in the fight against climate change. One such event is "Climate Sunday", an initiative launched last year by the Environmental Issues Network (EIN), which operates under the auspices of Churches Together in Great Britain and Ireland (CTBI). Churches and congregations across Ireland and Britain are invited to hold a local Climate Sunday on any Sunday before the 26th Conference of the Parties (COP26). Christians are called to participate through prayer, reflection, and climate initiatives. Climate Sunday forms part of the liturgical period known as the "Time for Creation", which runs from 1 September to 4 October each year. Over 1,500 Churches in England, Scotland, Wales, and Ireland have joined the Climate Sunday initiative. CAFOD, the charitable agency of the English and Welsh Bishops' Conference (CBCW), is also supporting the event.
