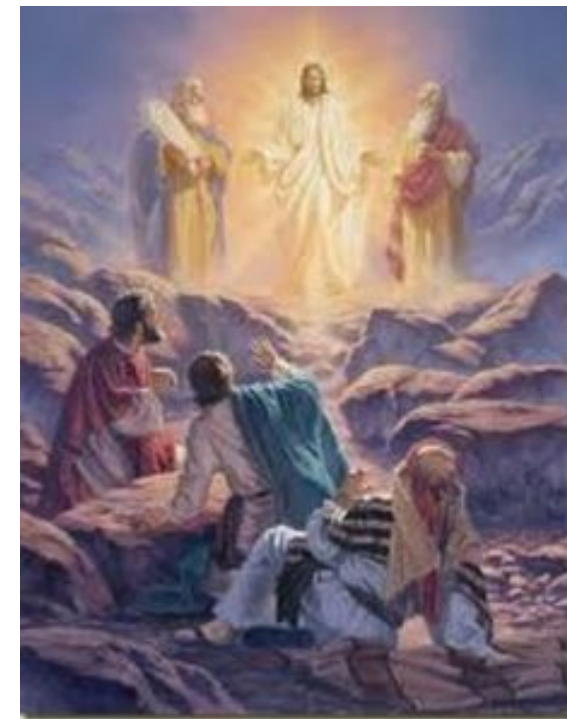

Our first reading today tells the story of God's call to Abram (later renamed Abraham) to leave his homeland and go to a new land that God would show him. This passage is significant in the Bible because it marks the beginning of God's covenant relationship with Abram and the foundation of God's plan for the salvation of humanity through the nation of Israel. Silver Arch Family Resource Centre
Health and Wellbeing Programme are delighted to bring a series of Mindfulness Sessions to support people living with dementia, and their families and carers for the month of March.
